### **B. Emergency Response Activities**

Search, rescue, evacuation and relief operations and damage assessment are being conducted by the member agencies of NDCC through their respective field offices.

#### **1. Search and Rescue (SAR) and Evacuation Operation**

- The elements of various emergency responders were able to rescue and evacuate 21,059 families or 77,694 persons to designated evacuation centers established all over Luzon.
- RDCC2 mobilized its Disaster Response Team composed of PRC2 RMG personnel to assist in the rescue operations.
- It was confirmed that all evacuees in the provinces of Albay and Catanduanes have already decamped since yesterday.

#### **2. Status of Areas Affected**

- Flooding still persist in the low-lying areas of Cagayan.
- 26 Brgys in Calumpit, Bulacan are under flood-water.
- **The provinces of Isabela, La Union, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, and cities of Tuguegarao, Santiago and Cauayan, and municipalities of Solana and Sta Praxedes, Cagayan declared their respective areas under a State of Calamity.**
- The Engineering Districts of the Department of Public Works and Highways in the affected regions are now undertaking clearing operations in the landslide areas

and emergency repairs of damaged roads and bridges in coordination with the Provincial Engineering Office of the local DCCs.

## II. Relief and Recovery Operations

- The NDCC facilitated the release of 3,450 sacks of rice amounting to P2,760,000.00 from the National Food Authority intended for the local disaster coordinating councils in the provinces affected by the successive destructive tropical cyclones that entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility such as: Typhoon "Unding", Tropical Storm "Violeta", Tropical Depression "Winnie" and Typhoon "Yoyong."
- The NDCC has been receiving donations in cash and in kind from local and international organizations and foreign countries intended for the victims of the above typhoons amounting to P38.059M. Pledges of relief goods, construction materials for damaged infrastructures and houses, air and sea vehicles for rescue operations and medical services were made by various donors/governments from foreign countries.
- The DSWD provided relief assistance to the victims of "Yoyong" and served 3,450 families or 17,061 persons in 126 evacuation centers: 15 in NCR, 109 in Region V, 1 in Region II and 1 in Region III, with relief supplies amounting to P1,047,445.00.
- DSWD FO V extended P604,000.00 worth of seven hundred fifty five (755) bags of rice to the following LGUs: Catanduanes 100, Camarines Norte 100, Libon, Albay, 35 and 4<sup>th</sup> District, Camarines Sur 520.
- The local Social Welfare Office of DSWD-NCR provided meals to the displaced families in various evacuation centers in Metro Manila.
- The DSWD-CO prepositioned stockpiles as augmentation support to the following areas: Isabela, 200 family packs, Santiago City 300 family packs and 20 packs candles, Sta Fe, Nueva Vizcaya 1,000 mini cups noodles, plastic spoons and 5 cases 3 in 1 coffee and Quirino 200 family packs.
- The LGUs of Bulacan provided 5,172 packs of relief goods, 500 packs of biscuits, 100 cavans of rice, 20 boxes coffee, 20 boxes noodles, 20 boxes of sardines, 30 sacks and 2000 packs of sugar to the municipalities of Angat, Balagtas, Bustos, Calumpit, Marilao, Norzagaray,, Pulilan, San Ildefonso and San Miguel..
- The NDCC through OCD Region III released 1,650 sacks of rice to the local officials and congressmen of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> District of Bulacan, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> District of Nueva Ecija, Governor of Nueva Ecija, Mayors of San Miguel, Bulacan, Dingalan, Aurora, Gen Tinio, Nueva Ecija and Cabanatuan City.
